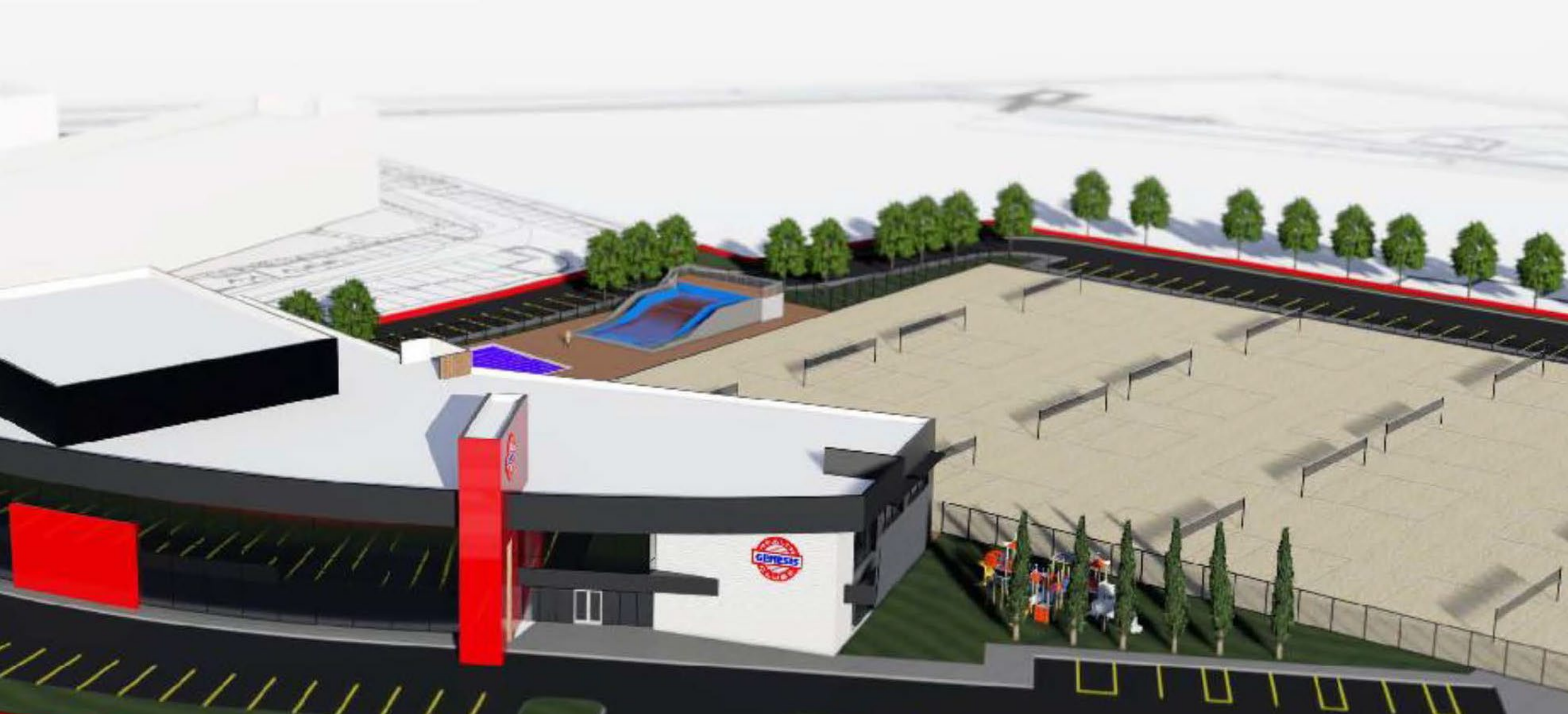

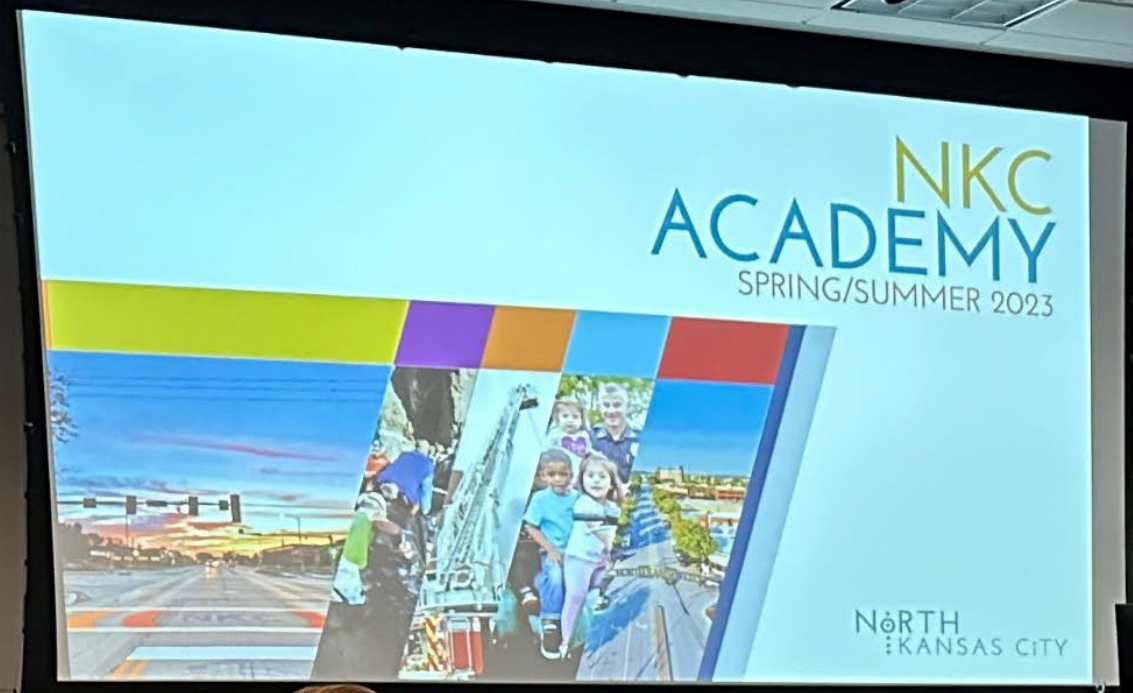

DEPARTMENT MISSION

The work of the Community Development Department impacts the past, present, and future of North Kansas City. We help plan for future development, issue permits and inspect ongoing projects, and ensure that existing buildings and neighborhoods are well maintained. A key element in our work is collaboration – with other city departments; with architects, engineers, and contractors; and with NKC businesses, property owners, and residents.

2022 Building Permits

60 residential building permits were issued in 2022. While this is a **30% decrease** in volume from the year prior, there was a **total project valuation of \$91,327,467**, compared to \$1,844,109 in 2021.

64 commercial building permits were issued, a 30% decrease from the year prior, with a **total project valuation of \$9,884,497**, compared to \$84,030,135 in 2021.

Inspections

City code inspectors conduct a wide range of **building, electrical, mechanical, plumbing, and fire** inspections as a permitted project progresses, ensuring the work being done complies with all City Codes.

673 inspections took place in 2022, compared to 671 in 2021.



Neighborhood Services

The Neighborhood Services division conducts residential rental inspections in order to ensure each dwelling unit provides a safe living environment for NKC residents. City inspectors review units for compliance with applicable building and fire codes.

278 rental inspections were performed in 2022, an **88% increase** from the year prior.

Common areas of focus are the presence of functioning smoke alarms, proper electrical outlets, and exit capability for emergencies.



Code Compliance

The City conducts systematic inspections of commercial and residential areas to ensure buildings and properties in North Kansas City are maintained.

The Code Compliance division sent out around 100 property maintenance violation notices in 2022 .

Common property maintenance issues include overgrown grass and vegetation, unsheltered storage, rubbish and garbage, storage of unlicensed/inoperable vehicles, roofing issues, overgrown trees, and unsafe structures.

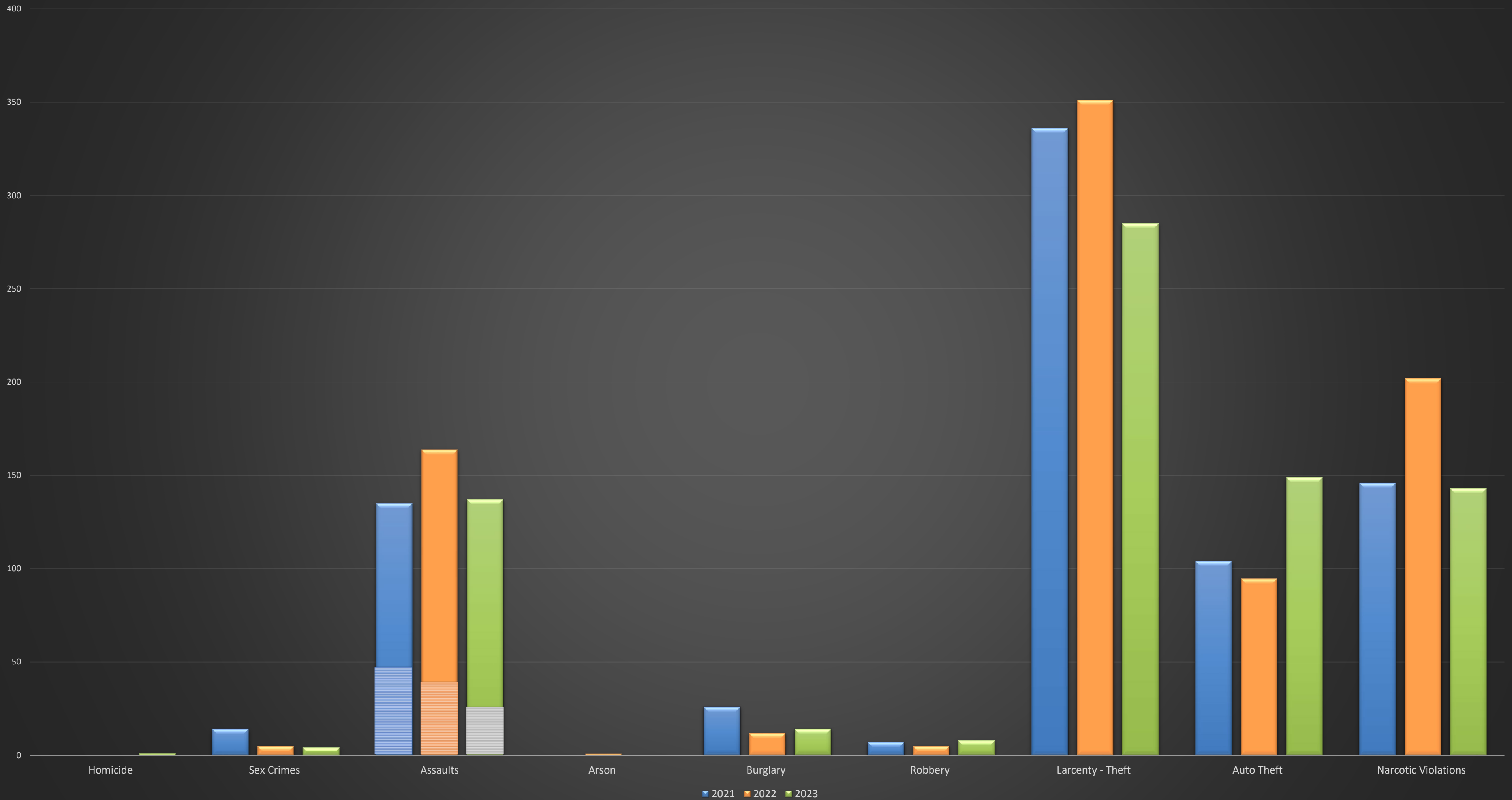

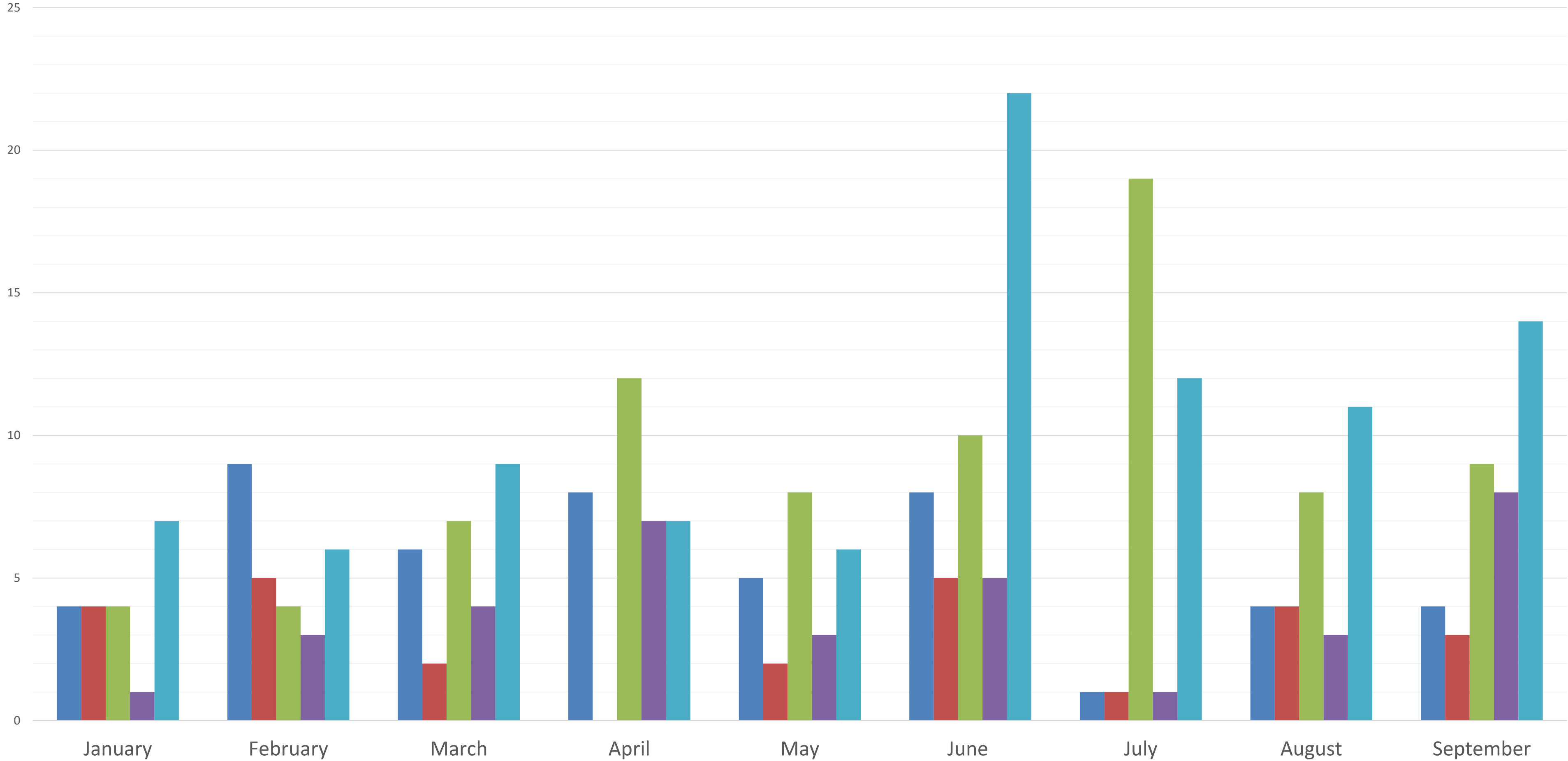

CIT TRAINING



Trained CIT Police officers carry on the normal duties of law enforcement, but switch to a specialist role when a potential mental health-related crisis is identified.

80% of Officers are CIT Certified

Why is CIT Training Effective:

1. Increases officer/citizen safety
2. Decreases police liability and litigation
3. Extends officers' skills
4. Increases on-scene expertise
5. Reduces the time officers spend at hospital emergency departments
6. Increases officer/community confidence
7. Increases professionalism
8. Empowers officers to divert person(s) with a mental illness to treatment
9. Increases cooperation between criminal justice and mental health systems
10. Establishes responsibility and accountability
11. Decreases arrest rates
12. Reduces recidivism

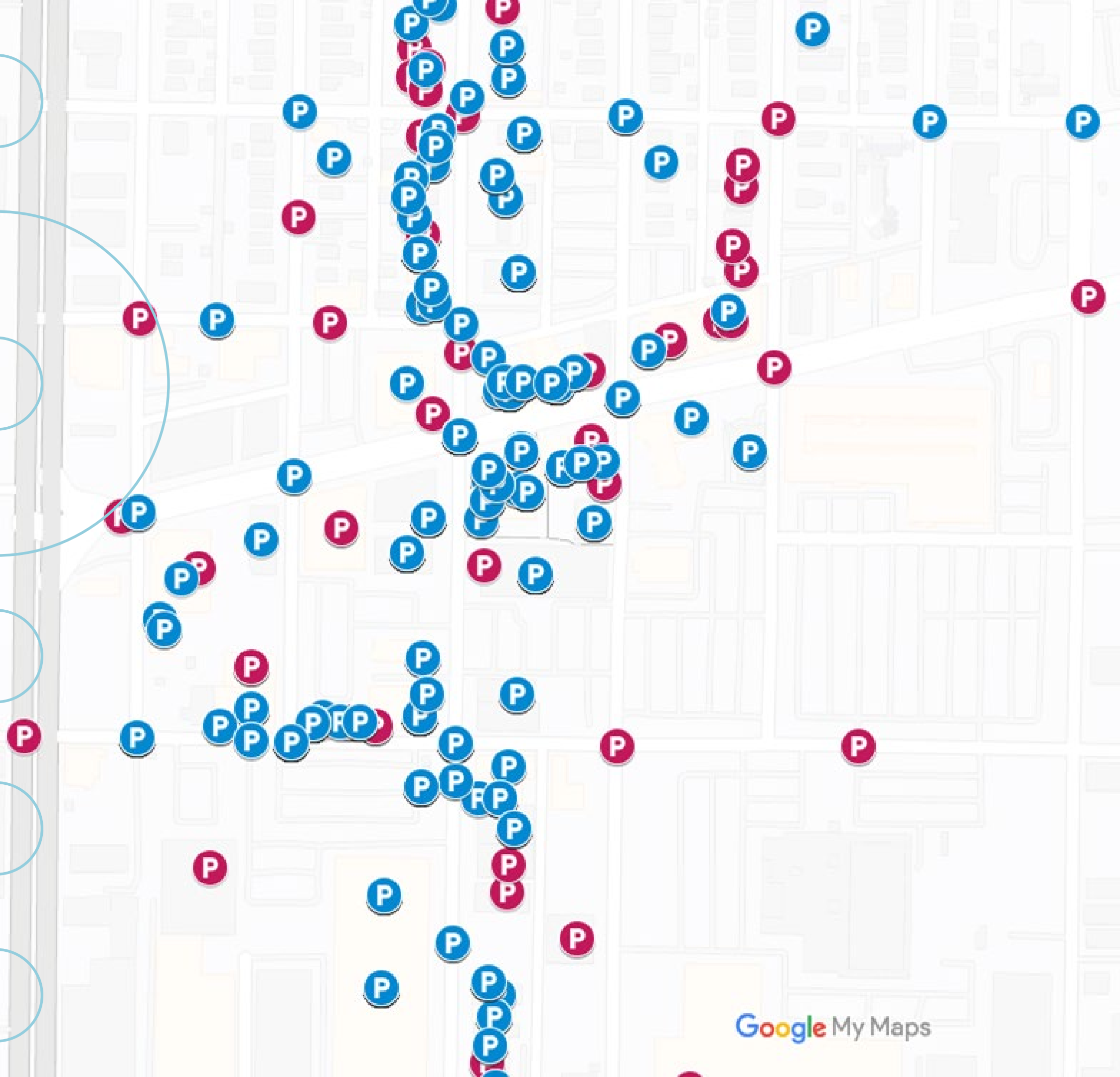
SECURITY CAMERAS



- **DETERRENCE OF CRIME:** Quality surveillance cameras act as a powerful deterrent to criminal activity.
- **EVIDENCE COLLECTION:** Surveillance cameras provide crucial evidence in the event of criminal activities, accidents, or disputes.
- **ENHANCED SECURITY:** Surveillance cameras contribute to overall security by providing real-time monitoring of an area.
- **PROTECTION OF PROPERTY AND ASSETS:** In both residential and commercial settings, surveillance cameras help protect property and assets from theft, damage, and vandalism.
- **REMOTE MONITORING:** Quality surveillance cameras often come equipped with remote access and monitoring features.
- **REDUCTION OF FALSE CLAIMS:** In some cases, individuals may make false claims against a business or property owner, such as slip-and-fall accidents or theft allegations.
- **TECHNOLOGICAL ADVANCEMENTS:** Advances in surveillance camera technology have led to higher-resolution video as well as low-light and night vision capabilities.

While the use of surveillance cameras raises privacy concerns that need to be addressed through responsible and legal use, their benefits in terms of security, deterrence, and evidence collection are clear, making quality surveillance cameras a valuable tool in many contexts.
